Pledge of Allegiance

1. Listening Session regarding the Village Opting In or Out for Cannabis Dispensaries & Onsite Consumption:

a. Mayor Caza explained the Rules and Regulations regarding the Village's option regarding the Village opting in or out for cannabis dispensary and on-site consumption in the Village. The Mayor explained the Board's position on why they may want to opt out as they can always opt back in however if they opt in, they can never opt back out. The Mayor and Board would like to hold a Public Hearing to see how the majority of the Village Residents feel regarding this subject. Village tax payers/ business owners and village residents in the audience were for the Village Opting In and felt it would be a disservice to the Village to miss on possible income and possible improvements to the downtown business district. Village Clerk/Treasurer will be setting up a Public Hearing.

2. Privilege of the Floor:

a. Mark Stolzenburg approached the Board regarding access to the Village reservoir property in order to mow and maintain property owned by Jim Grant. Property owner would like access in order to get to their property once or twice a year with 24-hour notice to our DPW team.

3. Mayor Caza opened Public Hearing for Local Law #2- 2021 Tax Cap Override at 7:22PM

a. Mayor Caza read Local Law # 2-2021 regarding the Tax Cap override and explained the intent of this local law is to allow the Village to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2022, that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the tax levy limit as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c. There were no public comments.

a. Letter from the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance program introducing a new water assistance program (LIHWAP) from New York State asking if the Village of Schoharie would sign a Vendor Agreement effective December 1, 2021. Mayor Caza suggested that a letter introducing this program to the homeowners be included in the next Water/Sewer Bills.

<u>Motion</u> made by Trustee Johnson second by Trustee Robinson-Bullock unanimously carried to approve the Mayor signing a Vendor Agreement for LIHWAP after advice from Village Attorney David Brennen.

8. New Business:

- a. December meetings are back-to-back, December 14th and 15th should we keep these dates or change the Employee meeting to the 22nd. Since there is a Public Meeting on the 14th the Board would like to keep the meetings as originally scheduled.
- b. Resolution 5-2021 to relevy all unpaid water and sewer rents for the 2021 fiscal year to the County for insertion on the Village and Town tax bills due out on January 1, 2022.

<u>Motion</u> made by Trustee Palmer second by Trustee Johnson unanimously carried to approve Resolution 5-2021 for Clerk to relevy all unpaid water and sewer rents for the 2021 fiscal year.

9. Old Business:

a. The Invoice to SMC for water hookup is still unpaid. Mayor Caza would like the Clerk to see if this can be sent over with the relevy. If not, the Clerk will contact the Village Attorney and seek legal action.
